City of Tea Regular Meeting April 18, 2016

A regular meeting of the Tea City Council was held at Tea City Hall on April 18, 2016 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor John Lawler called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: Sidney Munson, Chuck Ortmeier, Joe Weis, Larry Rieck and Todd Boots. Also present: Finance Officer Dawn Murphy, Utility Superintendent Thad Konrad, Police Chief Jessica Quigley, City Engineer Ben Scholtz and Administrative Assistant/Economic Development Director Jenni White. Councilmember Brian Fowlds and Planning & Zoning Administrator Kevin Nissen were absent.

**AGENDA. MOTION 16-57. MOTION** by Weis, seconded by Boots to approve the April 18, 2016 agenda. All members voted AYE.

**MINUTES. MOTION 16-58. MOTION** by Ortmeier, seconded by Rieck to approve the April 4, 2016 minutes. All members voted AYE.

**WARRANTS. MOTION 16-59. MOTION** by Ortmeier, seconded by Weis to approve the warrants as presented. All members voted AYE. Warrants will be listed at the end of the minutes.

**CUP #16-01 PUBLIC HEARING**. Mayor Lawler opened the public hearing for a group day care at 640 N. Christine Ave. There were no comments for or against the permit. **MOTION 16-60**. **MOTION** by Boots, seconded by Rieck to approve Group Daycare Conditional Use Permit #16-01 for Sarah Eichmann, 640 N. Christine Ave, Lot 5, Block 3, Nine Mile Heights Add. All members voted AYE.

1<sup>st</sup> **READING OF ORDINANCE 232**. As this was the time set, Mayor Lawler opened the public hearing for Ordinance 232 for the Rezoning of Lot 1, Block 3, Carl W. Soukup Addition from R2-Residential to General Commercial and Light Industrial. The zoning board had concerns with the industrial uses next to the Spencer Heights Addition multi-family uses. The owner is willing to screen along the back property line. The board also felt it's not the best location for multifamily and recommended approval. There were no comments from the public. The second reading will be held at the May 2, 2016 meeting.

**REGIONAL WASTEWATER STUDY.** Joe Munson and Tanya Miller, Banner Associates, gave a presentation on the Wastewater Regionalization Preliminary Engineering Study. Mayor Lawler will set up a meeting with HDR Engineering, Banner Associates, Councilmembers Fowlds and Munson, Thad and Dawn to go look at all the options presented.

**ZONING INFORMATION**. The planning and zoning board reviewed and approved the final and construction plans for Phase 2B, Hagedorn Addition. No action is need by the council. The board also has reviewed the Ponderosa Development Engineering Plans.
