A regular meeting of the Tea City Council was held at Tea City Hall on October 15, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.

**AGENDA. MOTION 18-224. MOTION** by Ortmeier, seconded by Erck to approve the October 15, 2018 agenda. All members voted AYE.

**MINUTES. MOTION 18-225. MOTION** by Weis, seconded by Ortmeier to approve the October 1, 2018 minutes. All members voted AYE.

**WARRANTS. MOTION 18-226. MOTION** by Ortmeier, seconded by Weis to approve the warrants as presented. All members voted AYE. Warrants will be listed at the end of the minutes.

1<sup>ST</sup> READING OF ORDINANCE 264. Mayor Lawler opened the public hearing at 7:15 p.m. for Ordinance 264 for the rezoning of Lots 2-8, Block 7, Howling Ridge Addition. From Agriculture (AG) to R2 Residential. Schwartzle Construction would be setting up single family detached homes or villas on the Z-lots. Residents Mitch Smith, Jay Ryan, and Brian Lowery were present to oppose the rezoning of the lots. Their concerns were the amount of space occupied by housing within the lots, and the possibility of multi-family housing being moved into the area. The R2 zoning allows for the lot widths to be a minimum of 65' and 5' side yards. The Planning & Zoning board recommended approval. The second reading will be held at the November 5<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**RESOLUTION 18-10-43.** A resolution providing for annual street maintenance assessment. **MOTION 18-232.** MOTION by Munson, seconded by Voelker to amend Resolution 18-10-43 that the amount of the assessment be raised from \$0.40 to \$0.50 per front foot. Munson, Voelker, and Erck voting AYE. Weis, Boots, Ortmeier, and Lawler voted NAY. Motion failed. Motion by Weis, seconded by Voelker to approve the following resolution. Voelker, Erck, Weis, Boots, and Ortmeier voting AYE. Munson voting NAY. Motion passed. WHEREAS, the City of Tea pursuant to SDCL 9-43 may levy annually for the purpose of maintaining and repairing street surfacing or pavement; and WHEREAS, the City of Tea believes it necessary and appropriate to maintain its streets, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Common Council of the City of Tea, as follows: 1. Designation of lots to be assessed. Pursuant to SDCL 9-43, all lots in the City of Tea fronting and abutting a street shall be assessed on the front foot basis. 2. Amount of Assessment. There shall be levied upon all lots fronting and abutting a street forty cents (\$.40) per front foot. Front foot means the actual front of the premises as established by the buildings thereon recorded title and use of the property regardless of the original plat. 3. Assessment. The City Finance Officer is directed to add such assessment to the general assessment against the property and certify the assessment together with the regular assessment to the county auditor to be collected as municipal taxes for general purposes. 4. Assessment subject to review. The assessment is subject to review and equalization the same as assessments or taxes for general purposes. Dated this 15<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2018.

**RESOLUTION 18-10-44.** A resolution declaring boundaries and recommending creation of Tax Incremental District Number One. MOTION 18-233. MOTION by Boots, seconded by Ortmeier to approve the following resolution All members voted AYE. WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Tea, South Dakota, received an application to create a Tax Incremental District and thereafter a Notice of Hearing was published advising interested parties that they were being given a reasonable opportunity to express their views on the proposed creation of a Tax Incremental District in the following location: Tract 1A and Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 1 of Bakker Landing 1st Addition and Tract 2 Bakker Landing, 1st Addition, an Addition in Government Lots 1 and 2 of the Northwest Quarter and in Government Lots 1 and 2 of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19, Township 100 North, Range 50 West of the 5th P.M., Lincoln County, South Dakota. WHEREAS, such Notice was published in the official newspapers in the City of Tea, not less than ten (10) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the hearing; and WHEREAS, a copy of the Notice was sent by first-class mail to the Chief Executive Officers of the following taxing entities: Harrisburg School District, Attn: Jim Holbeck – Superintendent, 200 Willow Street, Harrisburg, SD 57032; and Lincoln County, Attn: Auditor / Chair of Commission, 104 North Main Street, Canton, SD 57013. WHEREAS, a hearing was held on October 9th, 2018 by planning and zoning as provided in such Notice, and all interested parties were allowed a reasonable opportunity to be heard on the proposed creation of the Tax Incremental District; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tea, South Dakota: 1. Authority and declaration of necessity, Pursuant to SDCL §§ 11-9-4 & 11-9-13, the City of Tea hereby declares the necessity to form a tax incremental district in the City of Tea to help offset infrastructure costs related to an industrial / commercial park within the city limits of Tea for the purpose of economic development. 2. Findings. The City Council finds that there is statutory authority to create Tax Increment District #1 and that all notice requirements have been met and all findings required by statutes are hereby made. 3. Boundaries of District. The district shall be located with the northern, southern, western, and eastern boundaries of the following described real property: A. Tract 1A and Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 1 of Bakker Landing 1st Addition and Tract 2 Bakker Landing, 1st Addition, an Addition in Government Lots 1 and 2 of the Northwest Quarter and in Government Lots 1 and 2 of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19, Township 100 North, Range 50 West of the 5th P.M., Lincoln County, South Dakota. Dated this 15<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2018.
