City of Tea Regular Meeting April 15, 2019

A regular meeting of the Tea City Council was held at Tea City Hall on April 15, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor John Lawler called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: Sidney Munson, Jim Erck, Chuck Ortmeier, Joe Weis, Casey Voelker and Todd Boots. Also present: Finance Officer Dawn Murphy, Utility Superintendent Thad Konrad, Planning & Zoning Administrator Kevin Nissen and City Administrator Dan Zulkosky.

PUBLIC COMMENTS. Justin Taylor, 2705 N. Devon Ave., discussed concerns he has with the drainage behind his house. This will be checked out.

AGENDA. MOTION 19-58. MOTION by Ortmeier, seconded by Weis to approve the April 15, 2019 agenda. All members voted AYE.

TICKET DISPUTE. Josh Heutzenroeder was present to dispute two tickets he received for his dogs running at large. His dog got out on 4/5/19 and 4/6/19. City of Tea Ordinance 199, Chapter 7, Section 7.02 states "The fine for an animal running at large is Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). It shall be Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) for each additional offense for the same animal within a twelve (12) month period and taken to an animal shelter". He was given tickets for both offenses, however the second offense he was fined \$350. He has since given the dog away. MOTION 19-59. MOTION by Voelker, seconded by Munson to forgive the \$350 fine. Members Voelker, Munson, Erck, Boots and Weis voted AYE. Member Ortmeier voted NO. Motion carried.

REQUEST FOR ANNEXATION. Annexation petitions have been received for several properties in the Hagedorn Industrial Park Addition (SE ½, S25-T100N, R51W with exceptions). SDCL 9-4-1 requires the petitions be signed by three-fourths (75%) of the value of the territory sought to be annexed. After the petitions were received 4 properties asked to withdraw their petitions, which resulted in 74.80% in favor of annexation. There were several people present who spoke on both sides of the issue. No action was taken due to not having 75% in favor of the annexation.

REAL ESTATE PURCHASE AGREEMENT. The City received the Real Estate Purchase Agreement from Sundowner Investments, LLC for the land that is needed for the new meter building. **MOTION 19-65. MOTION** by Boots, seconded by Munson to approve the Real Estate Purchase Agreement between the City of Tea and Sundowner Investments LLC to purchase Tract 3, Bakker Landing 1st Addition, 29,916 sq. ft., \$239,328.00 with the following terms: \$134,622.00 will be paid at closing and \$104,706 will be held by the buyer as a credit toward future assessments which may be levied against the property owned by the Seller for improvements to 85th St. or Sundowner Ave. The retained credit may be applied to assessments which may be levied against the Seller's property prior to December 31, 2020 for improvements to 85th St. or Sundowner Ave. If no assessments have been levied against the Sundowner Investments LLC property prior to December 31, 2020 then the retained credit shall expire and be retained in full by the Buyer. All members voted AYE. The purchase agreement is on filed at City Hall.

TAP AGREEMENT. The City has received the Transportation Alternatives Program Grant Agreement for the Tea Athletic Complex Shared Use Path – Phase 3 Project. This 2,500' long, 10 ft. wide path that will connect phase one and phase two of the Tea Athletic Park. The trail will be located along 7th St. on the south and Main Ave on the east. The grant will pay for 80% of the project (\$220,248.64) with the City paying the remaining 20% (\$55,062.17) from sales tax revenue. **MOTION 19-68. MOTION** by Weis, seconded by Voelker to approve and authorize the Mayor to sign the Transportation Alternatives Program Agreement between the State of South Dakota, acting by and through its Department of Transportation and the City of Tea, SD. All members voted AYE.
