City of Tea Regular Meeting November 7, 2022

The regular meeting of the Tea City Council was held at Tea City Hall on November 7, 2022 at 7:00 pm.

Mayor Casey Voelker called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with the following members present: Terry Woessner, Ruby Zuraff, Aaron Otten, Lynn DeYoung, James Erck and Joe Weis. Also present: Finance Officer Dawn Murphy, Planning and Zoning Officer Kevin Nissen and City Administrator Dan Zulkosky.

PUBLIC HEARING. Mayor Voelker opened the public hearing for a liquor license location transfer. There were no comments for or against the transfer. **MOTION 22-174. MOTION** by Weis, seconded by Otten to approve the Retail (on-off sale) Malt Beverage & SD Farm Wine License location transfer for The Big Dill, LLC, from 315 N. Heritage Pkwy, Zelmer 2nd Add., Lot 1B, block 1, limited to the area labeled 315 N. Heritage Pkwy to 46992 271st St., Southwest Industrial Park Addition, SE ¼, Lot 1 Subdivision of Tract 1A, Tea, SD. All members voted AYE.

PUBLIC HEARING. Mayor Voelker opened the public hearing for a new Retail (on-off sale) Malt Beverage & SD Farm Wine License for Boss' Pizzeria & Sports Bar 2 (casino). There were no comments for or against the license. **MOTION 22-175. MOTION** by Otten, seconded by Erck to approve the new Retail (on-off sale) Malt Beverage & SD Farm Wine License for Boss' Pizzeria & Sports Bar 2, Byron's Addition, Lots 1, 2 & 3, Block 2, limited to the area labeled 205 S. Main Ave. All members voted AYE.

ANIMAL AT LARGE TICKET. Joe Pania addressed the council regarding an animal at large ticket he received. His dog chased a cat that had run into his yard into the neighbor's yard. The battery in his dog's invisible fence collar had died. He asked that the ticket be dismissed or the cat receive an at large ticket as well. After a lengthy discussion,

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MOTION 22-176. MOTION by Erck, seconded by Zuraff to dismiss the ticket. Members Erck, Zuraff, Woessner and Otten voted AYE. Members DeYoung and Weis voted NO. Motion carried and the ticket dismissed.

MUELLER LAND DEVELOPMENT. There was a lengthy discussion regarding the proposed development along Sundowner Ave. and Gateway Boulevard. They would like a right in, right out driveway off Sundowner Ave. HDR Engineers Jason Kjenstad and Ben Scholtz are opposed to the driveway. The proximity of the driveway would impede traffic flow and cause safety concerns. It was the consensus of the Council that they did not want the right in/right out due to the safety concerns of the engineers. No official action was taken.

GC ESTATES PREIMINARY PLAN UPDATE. The preliminary plan for GC Estates located north of High Pointe St and West Cole Ave had been approved at the July 5, 2022. However, neighbors along the development had drainage concerns. The developer has amended the plan and has agreed to install a pipe that would run on parallel to 468th, on the westside, which should eliminate most of the drainage ditch behind the homes and add a small detention pond. No action was taken.

INTERSECTION OF 1ST ST AND MAIN AVE. There was a discussion on the lack of a crosswalk at 1st St. and Main Ave. The mother of a child that had been hit at the intersection was present to ask that a crosswalk or 4-way stop sign be installed. A traffic count/study will be done in the near future to determine the best solution.

FIREWORKS ORDINANCE. There was a brief discussion on amending the fireworks ordinance. The council will try to have a first reading of the ordinance at the next meeting.
