City of Tea Regular Meeting December 6, 2021

The regular meeting of the Tea City Council was held at Tea City Hall on December 6, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor John Lawler called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with the following members present: Jim Erck, Terry Woessner, Casey Voelker, Sid Munson and Joe Weis. Also present: Finance Officer Dawn Murphy, HDR Engineer Ben Scholtz, Planning & Zoning Officer Kevin Nissen and City Administrator Dan Zulkosky.

AGENDA. MOTION 21-178. MOTION by Woessner, seconded by Weis to approve the December 6, 2021 agenda. All members voted AYE.

CONSENT AGENDA. **MOTION 21-179. MOTION** by Munson, seconded by Weis to approve the following consent agenda items:

- 2) Approval of December 6, 2021 Claims (claims will be listed at the end of the minutes) All members voted AYE.

There were no public comments.

DEVELOPER COST RECOVERY. Herman Otten presented a resolution for the council to adopt to recover his costs for a water and sewer line that he installed for his Ma and Pa's development. The resolution would recover \$59,629.00 or \$64.81 per lineal foot from anyone that would hook up to this line. City Attorney Todd Meierhenry's opinion is that the city can not recover a private developer's costs. Other developers have asked for the City to recover their costs and have always been denied. Mr. Otten will have his attorney talk with Mr. Meierhenry.

MCKOY AUTO PLAZA. The council reviewed the design for a new building in the Bakker Landing Addition. Frank McKoy would like to build a 18,670 sq. ft. building that would be used for automotive businesses. The building would be on the northwest corner of Sundowner Ave and Industrial St. The building will have gables over the doors and windows and stone wainscoting on the front to enhance the aesthetics of the building. **MOTION 21-180. MOTION** by Weis, seconded by Woessner to approve the building design for a Frank Mckoy's building on Lot 7, Block 5 Bakker Landing 1st Addition. All members voted AYE.

ORDINANCE 289. The council held the second reading of Ordinance 289. **MOTION 21-181. MOTION** by Voelker, seconded by Erck to approve and adopt Ordinance 289, An Ordinance Creating Licensing Regulations for Medical Cannabis Establishments. All members voted AYE. The Ordinance was published separately on December 10.

RESOLUTION 21-12-22. MOTION 21-182. MOTION by Voelker, seconded by Woessner to approve the following resolution. All members voted AYE.

RESOLUTION 21-12-22. A RESOLUTION TO SET FEES FOR MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARY LICENES.

WHEREAS with respect to the initial application process for licensure of a medical cannabis dispensary, Ordinance Sec. 5.04(k) allows the City Council to establish by resolution a non-refundable fee to defray the costs incurred by the City for background investigations, review of the application, inspection of the proposed premises, and any other costs and labor associated with processing the application; and

WHEREAS Ordinance Sec. 5.04(I) allows the City Council to establish by resolution an annual fee for licensure of a medical cannabis dispensary; and

WHEREAS the City Council has not yet established the fees applicable to Ordinance Sections 5.04(k) and (l) and has determined that such fees must be set.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tea Board of City Council that the nonrefundable application fee for licensure of a medical cannabis dispensary pursuant to Ordinance Sec. 5.04(k) shall be \$1,500.00; and

IT IS ALSO HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tea City Council that the annual fee for licensure of a medical cannabis dispensary pursuant to Ordinance Sec. 5.04(I) shall be\$10,000.00.
